The Council of the Parish of St. John the Baptist, State of Louisiana, met in Regular Session in the Rudolph Soraparu Chambers, Edgard, Louisiana on Tuesday, January 14th, 2014, at 6:30 PM.

CALL TO ORDER:

Councilman Perrilloux led the Prayer. Councilman Snyder led the Pledge.

INTRODUCTION OF BUSINESSES

Lennix Madere - Recognition - Dray Joseph - MVP SWAC Eastern conference, MVP SWAC, MVP SWAC championship game, MVP Historical black college network

Councilman Madere introduced and presented Mr. Dray Joseph with a plaque in recognition of his accomplishments as MVP SWAC Eastern conference, MVP SWAC, MVP SWAC championship game, MVP Historical black college network. He and his parents were present and thanked the council and the parish for recognizing him with this honor. The entire council congratulated and praised Mr. Joseph for his accomplishments.

Lucien Gauff - Presentation - Willow Bend recycle facility

Derek Rice was present from Willow Bend Recycle facility. He gave a brief presentation explaining the benefits that the recycle facility would bring to the parish. Councilman Gauff did comment that he knew that the West Bank was not in favor of this endeavor and that many town halls have discussed this at length. He commented that he nor Councilman Smith will not do anything that the constituents of their district are opposed to he was just allowing Mr. Rice the opportunity to make his presentation to the parish. Many residents of the West Bank spoke in opposition of the site among those were Mr. Lionel Baily, Mr. John Cummings, Mrs. Charmaine Roybiski, Mr. Warren Pierre, Mr. Norman Maurin and Mrs. Nancy Dumas who also had a petition signed by the residents opposing the recycle facility. Mrs. Trudy Borne commented in favor of the facility. The council commented that they were not in favor of anything that the West Bank residents were opposed to and would always take their best interest and wellbeing to heart.

Larry Snyder - Presentation - Reanda Fields Pierre - "Love Going Home"

Mrs. Reanda Fields was present just to let the public know that they would be hosting a Housing Fair that will take place next Saturday, January 25, at the Community Center from 11:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. The event is free and open to the public and will provide information on credit repair, buying a home, mortgage programs and selling your property. Attendees will also get the opportunity to speak with real estate agents, mortgage lenders and housing specialists. She explained the opportunities out there for first time home owners to see what is available and possible for them in this economy.

The motion passed with Councilwoman Millet and Councilmen Wilson and Smith.

Councilman Perrilloux asked, *"Every year we give these parade permits for the MLK parade can we just give a blanket permit or do we need to do them individually?"*

Natalie Robottom stated, *"It has to be done individually."*

PUBLIC HEARING ON ORDINANCES:

There were no ordinances at this time.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Councilwoman Hotard stated, *"I did have to chair the finance committee so at this time I would ask that the council accept the recommendation of the finance committee."*

MOTION: Councilman Snyder moved and Councilman Wright seconded the motion to accept the recommendations of the finance committee. The motion passed with Councilwoman Millet and Councilmen Wilson and Smith

absent.

DEPARTMENT/ENGINEER REPORTS:

Councilwoman Hotard stated, "I wanted to ask two questions to give an update on the status of the street lights in St. Andrews if you know the subdivision and also the second item would be on the situation of the drainage ditch behind Goshen Lane."

Brian Nunes, Director of Roads & Bridges, stated, "First I will handle the Goshen Lane question, the administration along with myself investigated that along with our legal counsel. The only information we can find indicates that it is all private property where the ditch is and additionally checking the work order system we have no history of cleaning it. There have been stories of it but I just don't have any proof of it which is not to say that we didn't do it at all however just based on the fact that it is private property we have not cleaned it recently since I have been director. That may be an issue that we have to investigate further."

Councilwoman Hotard asked, "So if it is private property it is their ditch?"

Brian Nunes stated, "The parish doesn't have a servitude there is no drainage servitude there."

Councilwoman Hotard asked, "So do you have to investigate anything or look into anything else and I just want to give an answer to the residents if it is their ditch they can fill it. If it is not their ditch or the parish isn't going to maintain the drainage ditch because they just have stagnate water behind their homes and are trying to address that situation. The parish has cleaned it in the past. I am not sure if they drain from the other side of the Airline to there but I just want to get some clarification if it is absolutely not our ditch not our responsibility to advise those residents that they can proceed with what they need to do to protect their property."

Brian Nunes stated, "Well based on what we see it is private property. I am not going to advocate the closing of the ditch and again you need to look at how that ditch would adversely affect neighboring properties I believe there is a code involved in that so I am not advocating filling in the ditch but from what we have seen it is private property."

Councilwoman Hotard stated, "Thank you and then on the street lights I can actually get with you after. I took a drive through I believe there is only two that are still out unless you have something different."

Brian Nunes stated, "Not at this time."

Jaclyn Hotard - (Carry Over 12-23-13) Code Enforcement - Personnel matters

Councilwoman Hotard asked that this item be carried over.

Lennix Madere - (Carry Over 12-23-13) Water bill issues

Councilman Madere asked that this item be carried over.

Lennix Madere - Infiltration - District III

Councilman Madere stated, "I see the response says that 60% of the work has been done and I know we spoke Friday and the concern I have is that do we have a projected time frame as to when we are going to finish?"

Gerald Babin, PEC, stated, "I can answer that question according to the contractor I received a letter today. Suncoast infrastructure anticipates being finished with the project in the middle of February. He is bringing in some extra crews as we have discussed. There are two portions to this project. One is the lining portion and another is the point repairs. He has now brought in a second point repair contractor and in addition he has brought in a second crew of one of the point repair contractors so we should be or he anticipates being finished with the lining portion within two weeks and to finish up the rest of the work by the middle of February."

Councilman Madere stated, "Okay one other thing I think we spoke about to whenever I speak to someone in private I still like to have it on the agenda because I would like for the people who I represent to hear it themselves. We also talked about the fact that they had some repairs that they had to go back and do over and at the time I think you told me there were about 22?"

Gerald Babin stated, "Yes sir there are about 10 left to do."

Councilman Madere asked, "Okay and these repairs are going to make sure that we don't have that problem that we would have had if we had left the ones that they placed in place. One other thing concerning this project when they finish in mid-February will that include the fact that they will be finished repairing the spots that they dug up or do we have to still go beyond that?"

Gerald Babin stated, "That is the goal. The goal is to complete the project including the road work."

Lennix Madere - Planning & Zoning grass cutting ordinances

Councilman Madere stated, "I think they say refer to legal counsel and I think this is concerning we were supposed to petition the state about eliminating that extra 15 days. How far have we gotten with that or did we do that?"

Jeff Perilloux, Legal Counsel, stated, "That is all in the works."

Councilman Madere stated, "Okay it is still in the works. Will it be finished before the season comes in?"

Jeff Perilloux stated, "I can't really say but I can let you know by the next meeting."

Councilman Madere stated, "Okay thank you that is what I was concerned about. One other thing about P&Z with the grass cutting I know for the season is when we have the code enforcers out there for the height but I'm noticing that we have what I call winter growth where some of the

grass that grows in the winter time is above that level. Are the code enforcement officers actively writing these up too?"

Angelica Sutherland, Director of P&Z, stated, "Yes."

Councilman Madere stated, "Okay thank you."

Councilwoman Hotard stated, "Just to touch on the first item it is going to take something from Baton Rouge to go ahead and change that and then on the second item with the growth we are also working on introducing something to reduce the height of the grass before we can site it. They just actually adopted something in Jefferson on it so we are working on that."

Larry Snyder - Code Enforcement - budget line item

Councilman Snyder stated, "We can remove that item I got what I was looking for."

Larry Snyder - Update on drainage study in District VI

Councilman Snyder stated, "Brian what do you have for me? I know they are doing some work in the back I passed back there yesterday and saw them but I am a little concerned about West Frisco we need to look at that and those two things right now I'm concerned about and I know you told me that they were going to do some work on W. Frisco as soon as they finished some parts of the back part of Cambridge. Have they done that or reported anything to you?"

Brian Nunes stated, "I actually spoke with them today about Cambridge and W. Frisco is a separate issue but Cambridge they have all of the inspection done. We are having just a little bit of trouble right now finishing the cleaning towards the back because the water is high and there is a lot of water in the pipes. So we are having issues with that but I spoke with them today and they said within 2-3 weeks all of Cambridge will have been cleaned and post inspected and we will have some deliverables on that. The W. Frisco issue after we spoke about it at the council meeting we decided we were going to take certain steps to get to where we want to be. I spoke to CES and they were in Cambridge at the time and I had them pull off and they went out and ran video through that area the trouble spot they did find some blockages. It wasn't completely blocked by any means but there was some blockage. So the following day they sent the cleaning truck over there and cleaned all of those lines. So the report I got from them was that yes it was cleaned there may have been an offset joint or two but that is not going to impede the flow very much maybe a little bit but not enough to flood a house. So what we did was wait for it to rain again which it did yesterday. It rained pretty good me and Mr. Vincent took a ride out there and we didn't see any problem now that is not to say that there won't be in a major storm but that is something that we are going to keep an eye on and again we are going to progress along the steps that we said we would in the beginning which is first video, then clean, that part is done and if we continue to see problems we are going to survey and find out exactly where our issues are but we have started on that area."

Councilman Snyder stated, "Good thank you for the note you sent I need

to talk to you sometime this week or next week."

Larry Snyder - Update on electric lift pumps

Councilman Snyder asked, "Could you please give us an update so that we know where we are at Mr. Vincent?"

Randy Vincent, CAO, stated, "I'm sorry Mr. Rayneri isn't here tonight but the parish did get authorization from FEMA to replace the diesel driven pumps with the electrical pumps. The procurement process was completed, pumps were ordered and they will be installed once delivered. We are not sure if they are all going to come in at one time or come in separately but as soon as we get the first pump in we will start installing those pumps. We already have the electrical infrastructure in for the most part so it won't be a lengthy installation process. They will come in on skids and we will be able to move them in and get them hooked up in relatively short order."

Councilman Snyder asked, "You don't know if you set up a priority of where you want to start with those installations?"

Randy Vincent stated, "Mr. Snyder I do not know if we approached that yet but I do know that we have received complaints over a certain period of time so we may go back to when we first received the complaints or see where there are closer to homes. So I am sure with the help of public works and with the parish presidents input we will figure out where to start with it."

Councilman Snyder stated, "Good. If you don't mind I would like to have some input into that too in my area."

Randy Vincent stated, "We welcome that from all of the council members who have residents who are being affected by this."

Larry Snyder - Update on street repair and striping

Councilman Snyder stated, "I think I spoke with you about this and you told me you were going to start doing some of that in house. I am just concerned now about a few streets that have caved in. I think they might be altering water flow. I think where I saw some streets caving in especially the ones that have a lot of traffic and that is on Hancock that streets had a lot of traffic and it has caved in right next to a drain so I am thinking it might be inhibiting some water flow so that is one that I would like to look at. I wrote it up but I don't know if they looked at it yet or they are waiting for this year but it has caved in."

Brian Nunes stated, "Hancock we actually did look at. You brought it to our attention so we took a look at it and we agree with you we think there is a problem with the pipe under the road. What we are going to do temporarily is probably put a little patch there to allow traffic to go over it because we are going to have to dig in there to find out what is wrong."

Councilman Snyder stated, "Yes because that one is heavily traveled."

Brian Nunes stated, "We are going to try to coordinate that rather than

shut down the road without any notice we will allow it to be passable for the time being so we can schedule something to shut the road and then open it up get our pipe fixed then repair the road correctly. As far as the striping we are looking into doing something in house."

Councilman Snyder stated, "Thank you."

Councilman Gauff stated, "Mr. Nunes on Central Avenue I know I sent you an email on that it just seems like going down Central from the River Road side the East lane it seems like there is a spot in it that is starting to like something is collapsing in it and I sent you the email to give you a better reference of where it is and that is one of the few things that I haven't heard anything from you on and Mr. Larry's comments kind of jarred my memory that I had sent something there I think it was the same email with the railroad track and how on Central it is so bad and what we could do as far as a follow up but if you could check when you are riding through or look at that it seems like something is going through with Central Avenue that main street where it seems like something is caving in or there is something that needs to be addressed."

Brian Nunes stated, "Right that is something I am going to have to coordinate with the state on because I can't just go tearing up their road."

Councilman Gauff stated, "I understand that I was just trying to get the process started by seeing if you could check it out and see if it is something that could be looked at before it really caused a problem."

Brian Nunes stated, "I will go back and pull that email again and get with the state and we will get back with you."

Councilman Wright asked, "Just a quick question, I know I had put a work order in a couple of months ago for some striping I think in River Forest is that going to be included when you go back and the weather permits and start striping again and knock them all out at once."

Brian Nunes stated, "Not all at once. It takes some time to get it done."

Councilman Wright stated, "Well I mean around the same time."

Brian Nunes stated, "What we wanted to do in that section was we wanted to finish the curb work and it is about done right now so once that is all said and if weather cooperates that is near the top of the list to be done in house."

Larry Snyder - Update on flashing signs in overlay district

Councilman Snyder stated, "I talked to Ms. Angelic about this and she said she had someone out there looking at it and didn't see any violations and before I go any further I am going to have to talk to her again. I pulled up the ordinance and to me there is still a little problem but it is only a problem if they are on. If they aren't on then it isn't a problem and in the daytime it isn't a problem but at nighttime it is a problem in some areas. I have it on film and you can

see it flashing on my camera so it is a problem."

Larry Snyder - Water bill notice, disconnect alert

Councilman Snyder stated, "Mr. Goodman and I talked about this at length and he said he is going to try to help us out a little bit with this. My only question was if my water is about to get cut off I need to know a date, put a date on it therefore I have something to work towards I can save a few dollars here because I know it isn't getting cut off until this day. It may not get cut off on that day but from that day on forward it will be cut off so that is what I was asking because right now that isn't on the bill. I would like to see that on there and that is all I would like to see and one other thing he and I talked about already as far as two or three bills going out in one month so I am satisfied with what he told me. He doesn't have to come up here to say anything but we are going to look at that further."

It would delay the implementation of Biggert-Waters for 4 years and provide relief to policyholders until FEMA certifies that their maps are accurate and reliable. The Senate has overwhelming support for the bill and is expected to vote this week. However, much more support is needed for the companion bill in the House of Representatives. Please contact our Congressman to request their support of the 4 year delay. For the short term - the budget bill which is expected to pass this week, has a 1 year delay of the grandfathering clause, but does not fix the problem. More time is needed to complete the process. I had the pleasure of welcoming the Louisiana National Guard 1084th Transportation Company home from their last tour in Afghanistan on Thursday. It was heart-warming to see all of the excited and happy faces greeting their loved ones as they stepped off the bus at National Guard Readiness Center. We are thrilled to welcome them back and we thank them for their service. Winners for the Shop Local Trivia Card game were recently selected and calls made to individual winners. bean construction of the Belle Terre/Airline Intersection Improvement Project, a \$1.9 million project that includes a double left turn lane from southbound Airline Hwy to Belle Terre Blvd., drainage work, widening of the existing roadway, construction of curb and gutter, and a curbed median. Motorists will experience alternating northbound and southbound right lane closures on Airline Hwy by Belle Terre between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. weather permitting this week.
